

THE MONROEVILLE TOWN COUNCIL MET ON THE ABOVE DATE AT 7 P.M. WITH THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS PRESENT DON GERARDOT, TIM BERRY, CHAD HEFFERNAN. AND JOAN BULTEMEIER .

THE MINUTES OF THE JULY 1ST 2020 MEETING WERE READ. JOAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE. SECONDED BY TIM AND PASSED.

PAY APP #5 WAS SUBMITTED FOR THE CURRENT MONTH CONSTRUCTIONS DRAW. MILLER CONTRACTING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$176,812.00 AND TO JPR IN THE AMOUNT OF \$16,222.00 CHAD MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE FOR PAYMENT. SECONDED BY JOAN AND PASSED.

BILL ETZLER FROM ENGINEERING RESOURCES ADDRESSED THE MEETING ABOUT A WASTEWATER STUDY. HE LISTED RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE LAGOONS. AND SUGGESTED THAT THE OCRA GRANT BE PURSUED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$370,000.

RON HALL ASKED ABOUT THE POSSIBILITY OF GETTING THE FILL STONE FOR THE WATER PROJECT SPRAYED DOWN TO REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF DUST BEING GENERATED. DON WILL CHECK WITH RON ROY FROM AG PLUS ON THIS.

IT WAS ALSO SUGGESTED THAT THE UNREGISTERED VEHICLES AND RV'S AROUND TOWN BE TAGGED AGAIN. DON WILL RELAY THIS TO TOBY.

ORDINANCE 658 WAS PRESENTED. THE ORDINANCE ESTABLISHES A \$50 RECONNECTION FEE FOR ANY SERVICE THAT HAS BEEN SHUT OFF FOR NON PAYMENT. TIM MADE THE MOTION SECONDED BY JOAN AND PASSED.

ORDINANCE 659 WAS PRESENTED THE ORDINANCE ESTABLISHED THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL ROADS AND STREETS INSIDE THE TOWN LIMITS TO THE DEFAULT OF 20 MPH WITH THE NOTED EXCEPTIONS.

JOAN MADE A MOTION SECONDED BY CHAD TO HELP THE HERITAGE BOOSTER CLUB WITH THE PAYMENT OF \$1000 FOR SUPPORT.



ORDINANCE NO. 658

WHEREAS, it was discussed at Town Council meeting whether to establish an ordinance relative to the re-connect fees to be paid by a person, firm, or entity who has had water supply services canceled or discontinued by the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Monroeville, Indiana having reviewed and considered recommendations and being duly advised, now concurs that it is advisable, necessary and appropriate to adopt an ordinance establishing a fee to be paid to re-connect to the Town's water supply when a person, firm or entity has had such water supply services canceled or discontinued for the reasons enumerated in Ordinance §51.20.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council for the Town of Monroeville:

The Monroeville Code of Ordinances shall be amended to include a new Town Ordinance as Ordinance §51.22 regarding connection fees after discontinuance of water supply services within the Town, which shall read as follows:

§51.22 RECONNECTION FEES


In order to re-establish water supply services to any dwelling, business or other location within the Town, any person, firm or entity who has had water service canceled or discontinued for the reasons enumerated in Ordinance §51.20 shall first pay to the Town all past due water fees as well as a re-connection fee in the sum of \$ 50.00.

Passed by the Town of Monroeville, Indiana this 5 day of Aug., 2020.



ORDINANCE NO. 659

WHEREAS, it was discussed at Town Council meeting whether to amend certain ordinances relative to establishment and regulation of speed limits for vehicles on public streets or highways within the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Monroeville, Indiana having reviewed and considered recommendations and being duly advised, now concurs that it is advisable, necessary and appropriate to adopt an ordinance amending and restating the speed limits for vehicle son public streets and highways within the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council for the Town of Monroeville:

The Monroeville Code of Ordinances shall be amended to revise the language of Ordinance No. 70.35 regarding the speed limits within the Town, which shall read as follows:


§70.35 TOWN SPEED LIMITS


(A) The speed limit for all vehicles on the public streets and highways in the Town of Monroeville shall be twenty miles per hour (20 mph), excepting the vehicles traveling on the following streets within the Town for which the speed limit shall be thirty miles per hour (30 mph): S. Washington Street, Monroeville Road and W. South Street.


(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or operate a vehicle in excess of the foregoing speed limits, when signs are in place giving notice thereof.


